CAPITAL CAMPAIGN UPDATE

In October 2016, the Friends of the Mendon Library announced the completion of a very successful capital campaign raising over \$458,000 in five years to benefit the new library at 22 N. Main St, Honeoye Falls, NY. In 2008, Mendon residents voted 3:1 to support a new library building as the library on Monroe St. was not handicap accessible or large enough to house the library collection. A public/ private funding plan aimed at providing a suitable building with the lowest impact to the taxpayers resulted. Funding sources included a voter-approved bond for \$1.35 million, a \$500,000+ New York State Construction Grant and a short-term bond approval note (BAN) for \$550,000 which the Heart of our Town Capital Campaign vowed would come from private donations.

The new Mendon Public Library opened on June 27, 2011, to rave reviews in our community. For the first time in decades, the library was both ADA-compliant

and suitably sized to shelve the entire collection. Throughout the campaign, community members have joined us enthusiastically in the new 7,340 sq. ft. space, and library visits and circulation have increased substantially each year the library has been open at 22 N. Main St.

As Chair of the Heart of our Town Capital Campaign, I am pleased to report that over the course of the campaign, the Friends of the Library paid off over \$458,000 of that \$550,000 BAN with private donations. Additionally, the Capital Campaign raised over \$100,000 through in-kind donations and various grant awards. The library's "Final Report of the Heart of our Town Capital Campaign" is available at the Library.

The funding for the Mendon Public Library's Capital Campaign came from four sources over the past five years totaling \$543,818.52. Of these monies, 57% came from general donations, 29% came from pledge payments, 9% was money raised at various special events, and 5% from historic brick sales. A heartfelt thank you to all in our community who joined together to ensure that our community has such an outstanding facility.

HELPING OUR CHILDREN GROW

As we think about all we are thankful for, community support tops the list! We are very grateful for the NYS Bullet Aid to Libraries that NYS Senator Rich Funke helped to secure for the Mendon Public Library. The Bullet Aid monies, combined with \$50,000 in New York State and Municipal Capital funding, donations from the May K. Houck Foundation, and Friends of the Mendon Public Library donations, will be used by the Town of Mendon to adapt our children's space. This will allow us to offer improved and more efficient, kid-friendly library services in our children's area.

The Mendon Public Library provides services to approximately 1,700 children each year and the library focuses on providing many opportunities for early literacy. Using current research and community input, the library proposed changes to the existing children's space that will give children and their caregivers the best possible place to gather, discuss, learn, and enjoy. According to experts, the best way to engage early learners is through literacy-rich and playbased pavilions that allow children to explore and navigate the world of reading. Libraries are no longer quiet "shushing" places, but vibrant, hands-on, exploration spaces that provide a range of early learning opportunities. As such, the current children's area will undergo a transformation to better organize the space to offer a cohesive, bright, safe, and engaging area for our young library users.

MEETING THE NEEDS OF ALL OUR PATRONS

In 2016, our Friends of the Library group provided funding so that the library could work with the Rochester Regional Library Council (RRLC) and Causewave Community Partners to spend time developing our brand as we look to better meet the needs of our patrons. This time-intensive project, pulled together our elected officials, our library leadership, library staff, and community partners to gauge our branding goals for 2017 and beyond.

Thanks to the generosity of the Max and Marian Farash Charitable Foundation, the Mendon Public Library now offers free solutions for patrons needing a location and the necessary equipment to conduct a wide variety of internet and/or computer-based activities. The 55" Smart TV, dvd player, and associated video and sound enhancements of this unit offers patrons the ability utilize user-generated content (dvd and/or presentations and images from

flash drives), as well as interactive services that run off internet applications (Skype, YouTube, and fee-for-service subscriptions), and computer-based applications. Each







COMMUNICATION AND TECHNOLOGY OFFERINGS AT THE MPL

In 2016, the Mendon Public Library saw a number of advances in our communication and technology offerings. We are pleased to report that we were able to upgrade our public computers and continue to offer free, open, high-speed wi-fi access throughout the library. Our wireless connection offers 50Mbps download and 5.6Mbps upload speeds. The May K. Houck Foundation and the Max and Marian Farash Charitable Foundation also supports video conferencing and Skype capacity, and a variety of scanning and wireless printing options. Kindles are available for loan. A laptop computer is available for in-library-use. Finally, we offer our patrons the opportunity to sign up for one of six, free, one-hour tech training sessions every week.

Access to Monroe County Library System's electronic downloads give our Monroe County cardholders the ability to download for free a variety of audiobooks, ebooks, magazines & newspapers, recorded and live stream events, videos, library apps, and databases. Be sure to check out the OverDrive app to access these downloads on your electronic devices.

Additionally, the library now offers the May K. Houck Digital Collection: a database of local yearbooks, photographs, newspapers, etc. To access this collection, simply visit mendonlibrary.org and click on the May K. Houck Digital Collection tab.



The library depends heavily on our community support from our dedicated Friends of the Mendon Public Library. This is an active, all-volunteer group that supports the library with advocacy and provides library enhancements above and beyond those allowed by the library operating budget.

The Friends have been active since 1989. They played a major role in the new library by donating \$25,000 in start-up funds for the Capital Campaign in 2010.

These monies were raised by Friends' book sales, which provide recycled, low-cost books to the community at a fraction of the cost of a new book. They host annual sales and an in-house bookstore.
