Programming:

On January 8 we are holding an official event to introduce the Feeder Watch program, thank St John's Episcopal Church for the gift that made this program possible and the Friends of MPL for their support, recruit volunteers, and The Bird House will be doing a public presentation on Backyard Birding.
- Programming Highlights for Kids & Teens Nov 2021 (Kelly Paganelli reporting):

Kids: Our Kids programs have moved inside for the winter months. Story Time Tuesday is happening inside the library with folks wearing masks and maintaining some distance. Working with Central and the Rochester Americans, we were able to host a Zoom Program with an Amerks Player and the Moose. Several of our patrons showed up on Zoom to hear the story and answer some hockey trivia. Two patrons won signed hockey sticks!!! The Story Telling Circle for Thanksgiving weekend only attracted one patron, but, we're pleased to offer a magic show in mid December with several programs during break week, including a Girl Scout-Led Game Day, Pottery Painting for Kids, Teens, and Adults, and a Teen Crafting Event utilizing upcycled book ends and binders.

Teen Involvement: In November, we had a great turn out for our Percy Jackson Trivia Night. The teens in attendance liked the idea of writing book reviews, so, we're working on a newsletter with teen book reviews for December. Teens are invited to two crafting programs over break week. We'll also be gathering in January for another Teen Trivia Night, this one based on Harry Potter.
