

THANKFUL FOR ALL WE CELEBRATED

A Report from the Mendon Public Library Board of Trustees President Cristina Romig

This past year, the Mendon Public Library (MPL) celebrated 10 years in its new building. It's hard to believe that in June 2011, the Library first opened its doors at 22 N. Main St. The years have flown by and 2021 found us even more thankful for our beautiful, accessible, and modern community library.

Continuing with the theme of gratitude, the Board of Trustees (BOT) is extremely thankful for the more than 25 years of leadership provided by MPL Director Laurie Guenther. Laurie retired this past summer after outstanding stewardship of the library. Under her leadership, the library at 22 N. Main St. was conceived of, developed, funded, and made operational. On behalf of a grateful community, the trustees express their sincere appreciation for Laurie's work.

With hearts full of thanks, we were able to hire a wonderful new director for the library. In August, the trustees hired Lyla Grills as MPL's new director. Lyla joined the library with nearly twenty years of experience in the Monroe County Library System, most recently as a Young Adult Librarian at Penfield Public Library. MPL's BOT was impressed with Lyla's development of creative, inclusive programming for teens, ongoing Monroe County Library System committee service, and steadfast commitment to professional enrichment while working at the Penfield Public Library.

This past year, the BOT recognized Anne-Marie Gordon for her work as a trustee. In 2021, Anne-Marie stepped down as a trustee after serving our community for five years. Anne-Marie was replaced on the BOT by Nipa Armbruster. Others on the BOT include: Alicia Zysman-Cromwell (Vice President), Craig Moscicki (Treasurer), Timothy Boldt, Alison Zero Jones (Secretary), Tom Ochsenhirt, and myself.

Meeting each month as a group, the trustees work with the Town Supervisor and the Town Board, especially Library Liaison Cynthia M. Carroll, to ensure the library meets the needs of our community while managing a tight budget. This year, the BOT was challenged by many factors, including COVID. I'm proud to report that with great effort and wonderful collaboration with staff, volunteers, elected leaders, and our community, we find ourselves looking back with much to be thankful for. Our library continues to adapt, grow, and respond to the changing needs and demands of our community. Looking forward, we're excited to begin a new strategic planning process in the coming year. Keep an eye out for ways to share your input on the future of our library in 2022.

A LOOK BACK AT ALL THAT MAKES OUR COMMUNITY GROW

A Report from the Friends of the Mendon Public Library President Nancy Holtby

This past year, the Friends of the Mendon Public Library (MPL) endeavored to adapt, grow, and continue to support the library. We tried our best to help keep our community safe and bring patrons back in the library and reading.

Meeting each month as a group, the Friends outlined priorities, assessed how to complement the library, and put those plans into place to bolster the library's facilities, materials, and offerings. Without conducting an annual appeal for the first time in several years, the Friends raised funds through the in-library bookstore, a plant sale, and generous donations from the community.

Midway through the year, the Friends joined forces with our community to honor outgoing MPL Director Laurie Guenther. Laurie retired after working at the library for more than 25 years. Donations from folks throughout Mendon allowed us to recognize the wonderful work Laurie accomplished during her tenure, namely, managing the conceptualization, funding, and building of our current library. In August, we gathered at Mendon Ponds Park and presented Laurie and her husband, Ken, with a generous gift card and suitcases for future travel. Additionally, a quilt created by library friends in honor of Laurie's tenure now hangs in the Children's Area. A bench outside the library near the book drop also recognizes Laurie's work.

Thanks to community support, the Friends were able to provide a bounty of wonderful offerings, including:

- Resources for video and book purchases and mobile hotspot service
- Program funding for speakers, presenters, and supplies
- Funding from local businesses that kept our Summer Reading Program strong
- A grant from St. John's Episcopal Church in Honeoye Falls to provide bird feeders, birding books, and bird educational programming/citizen science at the library
- Donations of slightly used books and audiovisual materials that permitted us to stock and operate an in-library Book Store full of great deals
- Community Members who shared displays of fairy houses, paintings, photography, prints, student art along with information on civic groups
- Time, treasure, and talent in adorning the library in seasonal decorations, including a very special 10-Year Birthday Trimming
- Engagement in social justice issues as promoted by volunteer-created book lists
- Girl Scouts, nursery schools, senior living communities and Fire Department Auxiliaries partnered with the library to share reading and learning opportunities across our community
- Donors who gave through Spring Flower Sale, Fall Membership Drive, and RoctheDay.

Please consider joining us. The Friends meet on the 2nd Tuesday of the month at 6:30 PM. All are welcome! Know that whatever the next year holds, the Friends will continue to tend to the library and support its continued growth and excellent standing in our community.











in 2021...Have you read them all?





2021 Revenue


