- Teen Involvement: Three volunteers at the Mendon Public Library were recently honored with "Young Citizen of the Year" designations by the Monroe County Legislature. Wednesday evening, June 15, the following young women were honored with this award, presented by County Legislator Rick Milne.
- Ivy Yates Ivy has volunteered at the library during her middle and high school career. She has been available to assist with programs and went above and beyond by doing several larger scale projects for us as part of her Girl Scout Gold Award. For her Gold Award, she collected, cleaned, stored, and crafted over 400 recycled gallon milk containers to make an igloo for the library. For over two years, our patrons enjoyed this special reading space! Ivy even conducted virtual Story Time programs in the igloo. In addition, she made a craft cart from scratch for library use. It's a wonderful piece of furniture that we use every day. Outside of the library, Ivy babysits, tutors at school, and works several jobs (strawberry picking, retail associate, and restaurant work among others). She is Captain of the HS Cheer Team and is a member of the National Honor Society. Ivy comes from a close family of five. Her older brother enlisted in the Navy. She and her younger brother are students at HFL. Ivy's parents are active community members.
