MPL Board of Trustees Regular Meeting Monday, December 5, 2022 7:00 pm in the Library

- Personnel: K. Farrell was hired as our new Library Page. Her main job duty is shelving. Library Page S. Sonricker resigned. M. Ferrigno is temporarily doing the Mendon Meadows Book Drop run twice a week due to Sonricker's departure.
- The MCLS Passport Program has brought in enthusiastic visitors from around the county. The Passport Program was originally going to run through December, but future runs of passports do not have an expiration date. We had a Staff Challenge activity here: staff was challenged to collectively complete the MCLS Passport program by collectively visiting all 30 libraries in Monroe County. Staff rose to the occasion and completed the challenge! We got together and discussed our experiences at the other libraries.
- Our computers will be installed on December 13 & 14. The network switch we had on order for some time finally came in. We were able to take advantage of federal e-rate meaning we are billed at 15% of the cost, thus saving approximately \$1000 on this equipment.
- We had issues with our copier which spanned a few weeks. The copier was unfortunately out of service for about a week, while a technician tried to diagnose and correct the problems. We had a loaner copier for about a week, and a new copier was installed on December 2.
- Members of our staff, volunteers, and Girl Scouts decorated the library for the holidays. Many items were handcrafted, and the Friends purchased some additional decorations as well. We were invited to participate in the Village of Honeoye Falls 1st Annual Business Holiday Decorating Contest, sponsored by the Village and the Rotary.

Canvases will need to be returned by January 10, 2023. The Friends of the Library will prep the show and open it to the public on Martin Luther King Day, Monday, January 16, 2023.

The entire community is encouraged to stop by for The Cozy Little Art Show Community Reception at 2 pm on Monday, January 16, 2023 with a Honeoye Falls Lima Mendon Kiwanis Club Hot Cocoa Bar set up at 2 pm. Kiwanis Club members will also be reading to our youngest patrons from 2 pm – 4 pm. The show will remain up through February with artwork returned to artists at the end of February.
