He is a thoughtful, engaging, creative presenter who gets kids fired up about reading. Many of the children in attendance shared that his books got them interested in reading on their own. Story Time, LEGO, Firefly Friends were all well attended. And, over break, we had lots of fun with a special Story Time Reader, local author Nykki Williams, Longhouse Talk, Fish Painting, BINGO, Eclipse Talk, and Black Storytelling League of Rochester.

In March, we'll have all our regular events for kids with a special Eclipse Program on Good Friday. April Break will find us sharing lots of fun activities with the students while they're away from school.

Our special Eclipse displays have garnered a fair amount of interest. We've brought these in from Central and shared them with our community. Deb D also created a wonderful solar system display that has proved engaging for students of ALL ages. The toys that we borrowed from Central over winter break were also appreciated.

The schedule for Summer Reading is almost all set. Just working on finalizing all the details of the program, including prizes and documents.

Teen Involvement: Sweet & Cute offered an excellent program for teens that was fully enrolled. Deb and Hanna have been working with Teens on Tuesday afternoons. These opportunities are building momentum.

In March, we will offer a fun 6x6 Small Art Production Class with Mrs. Zauski. We'll also have a travel talk and program on how to pass the New York Road Test.
