#### Lyla Grills Reporting

- Staff from RPL will be visiting MPL later this month for their Staff Day. MPL staff will visit Central in November for our Staff Training morning.

### Programming Highlights for September 2024 (Kelly P. reporting)

Kids: After a busy summer and a few weeks off for Story Time in August, our Story Time is back and bigger than ever. We have several new families joining us for Tuesday Story Time. Fireflies are back, too. They are fully enrolled with ten little ones and their adults showing up for fun with Miss Jennifer every Wednesday. Miss Rosa, a retired RCSD teacher, recently started offering Story Time in Two Languages. These sessions have been taking place every Friday. We thank Miss Rosa for volunteering to lead these Story Times. Miss Lori, also a retired teacher and current staff member of MPL, has also started offering a Saturday Story Time every other Saturday when she is working. All these programs take place at 10 am. Right now, we are excited to offer Story Time on Tuesday, Wednesday, Friday, and every other Saturday!

During September, Miss Lisa started up LEGO Club again. This will take place each month. Seventeen children and ten adults came for the first session.

Once again, The Friends of Mendon Public Library have supported our Children's area with new toys and crafting supplies. As always, we are thankful.

Look for library staff, Friends, BOT, and volunteers in the Fall Weekend Parade. We will have the Bookmobile and will be passing out library bookmarks. We will also have special programing on Indigenous People's Day – RMSC will be sharing their Bat Program on this day off of school.

Teen Involvement: Teens continue to volunteer at the library every other Tuesday afternoon with Deb D. We are thrilled that several teens volunteer at the library. Their efforts are most appreciated. In addition, we continue to have a few young adults help us as they work with their aids to secure work experience. We have one young man who comes twice each week to clean books and a few other young people who assist with non-technical library duties on a drop-in basis.

Mrs. Kirby's Middle School Class visits about twice monthly for library/community exposure. The staff looks forward to these visits and are thrilled to get to know these wonderful young people. Teen programs in September included a macrame air plant workshop and a pumpkin book folding workshop. We will be offering several teen events in October including an author talk with book giveaway as part of the Rochester Teen Read, Savings vs. Needs and Wants, and Spooky Halloween Program. We look forward to working with Nyla Armbruster and Eric Ahn for a special offering in November.

Our Teen and Children's Chapter Books are in process of being shifted. Lisa R helped us utilize circulation data to capture trends and allocate appropriate shelf space for each collection. Necessary shelf cleaning allowed us to donate several boxes of discarded materials to the library at Industry in Rush. They are most thankful for these donations.

Adults: Our Tech Sessions continue to draw a steady following. Thanks to Dan B for making this possible. Book Club and Knit Nook also remain popular. October will find us offering a new "Neighbors Meet and Greet" every Thursday from 11:15 AM – 11:45 AM. A new volunteer, Carolyn, has offered to host these sessions as a friendly gathering for all.

October will find us discussing Travel Apps, Rochester Transportation History, and AI for Everyone. We will also be participating in the Great Give Back to gather needed supplies for Wild Wings.
