We'll be offering a Sing Along, LEGO Club, Science with RMSC, Mercy Watson Birthday Party (with a free costume on loan from Pittsford Community Library), Break Week Movie Matinees, Fish Painting with 4H, LEGO Block Printing, Love Shack Making with the Story Book Cook, Black Storytelling and special Hot Cocoa Bar sponsored by Kiwanis.

- Teen Involvement: Deb D has had a terrific Tuesday Teen Volunteer turnout. Currently, they're working on colorful yarn pompoms to decorate with during the "Color Our World" Summer Reading Program.
- Over February Break, we'll be offering several teen programs Stacked Rock Watercolor Event, Backyard Chicken Keeping, LEGO Block Printing, and Black Storytelling. Teen Magic Game Night will also be happening on the 4th Monday of January, February and March thanks to a lovely family that has stepped off to offer this opportunity.
- Adults: We continue to offer Monday Morning Café, Friday Movie Matinees, and other fun programs for adults. In February our adult programs include The Tuskegee Airmen: A Rochester Connection (History), Finding Balance Meditation Program, Spams, Scams and other Shams, plus a Travel Talk on Ireland and Scotland.
- Our Adult volunteers have been terrific. They help us shelve, assemble crafts, tidy up our collection, and assemble crafts.
