- The TV and shades installation went very well. We hosted a Harry Potter Movie Marathon over the holiday break and have some additional movie programming planned during February break and on Fridays for Seniors/Adults.
- The new director of MCLS and RPL will be Emily Clasper, current associate director of Central Library.
- MPL patrons now have access to Udemy through the County/MCLS Digital Equity & Inclusion program. Udemy is an online learning platform with an extensive collection of courses available, covering diverse topics such as technology, business, arts, personal development, and more.
- MPL patrons also now have access to two Kanopy streaming bundles "British Cinema and TV Shows" and "Easy Watching." This was funded by MCLS.
